I, Clement I. O'Flynn, as County Manager for the County of Galway, by virtue of the Labourers Acts 1883 to 1950, and the Housing (Financial and Miscellaneous Provisions) Acts 1932 to 1950 and of every other power me enabling, hereby order that the lands situate in the County Health District of Galway, hereinafter described in the Schedule hereunder, and delineated and coloured red on the maps or Ordnance Sheets annexed hereto, and signed by me, be acquired compulsorily, as sites for the erection thereon of labourers' cottages, and that a compulsory purchase order to be called and known as "The County Galway (Land for Labourers' Cottages) Compulsory Order, 1951" be made for the purpose, which Order the Minister for Local Government will be asked to confirm.



I visited Aughrim in connection with a site for the new pump. The proposed site, as pointed out to me by Mr. Collins on an Ordnance Map, is situated within a ruins adjoining the forge in Aughrim village. The floor level of this ruins is below road level and, in my opinion, it is an unsuitable site. On the immediate opposite side of the road to these ruins there is an equally central site which conforms with our requirements. It is suitably raised, dry and well drained.

Needless to say, the erection of this pump will be approximately last on our list of pumps.



### EyreCourt Sewerage & Sewage Disposal

Dear County Manager,

I enclose you herewith plan showing proposed sewerage scheme for Eyrecourt. The proposals provide sewers for all existing houses and from inquiries made it seems that any future building will be confined within the area provided with sewers.

The full plans for the proposed scheme have been made out but for the present only the General layout plan is being forwarded as it will probably be ample for discussion at this stage. The details and considerations examined for the various sections are as follows:-

#### SEWERS

The population of Eyrecourt is taken at 400 and the Dry Weather Flow is taken at 250. Sewers are understood to be connected with sewerage system.

3. McDonnell & Sons, Limerick	£13,490. 7. 6

The lowest tender received is that of Malachy Burke (Contractors) Galway in the sum of £12,686. 16. 0. I have checked over the tender and find that there is a small error of £1. 10. 0 in this firm's tender. The correct tender sum should read £12,685. 6. 0. In Burke & Clancy's tender there is a small discrepancy of 9d. The correct figure should read £12,776. 10. 2.



### Records relating to a proposed Sewerage Scheme and Sewage Disposal at Eyrecourt.

An initial estimate for the scheme in 1952 for £14,700.0.0 was considered excessive in relation to the population of the town. The Scheme was re-examined and revised to an estimated cost of £12,100 in September 1953. The contract was awarded to Malachy Burke, Renmore, Galway, in 1958 for an estimate of £12,685.6.0. (53/115)






