

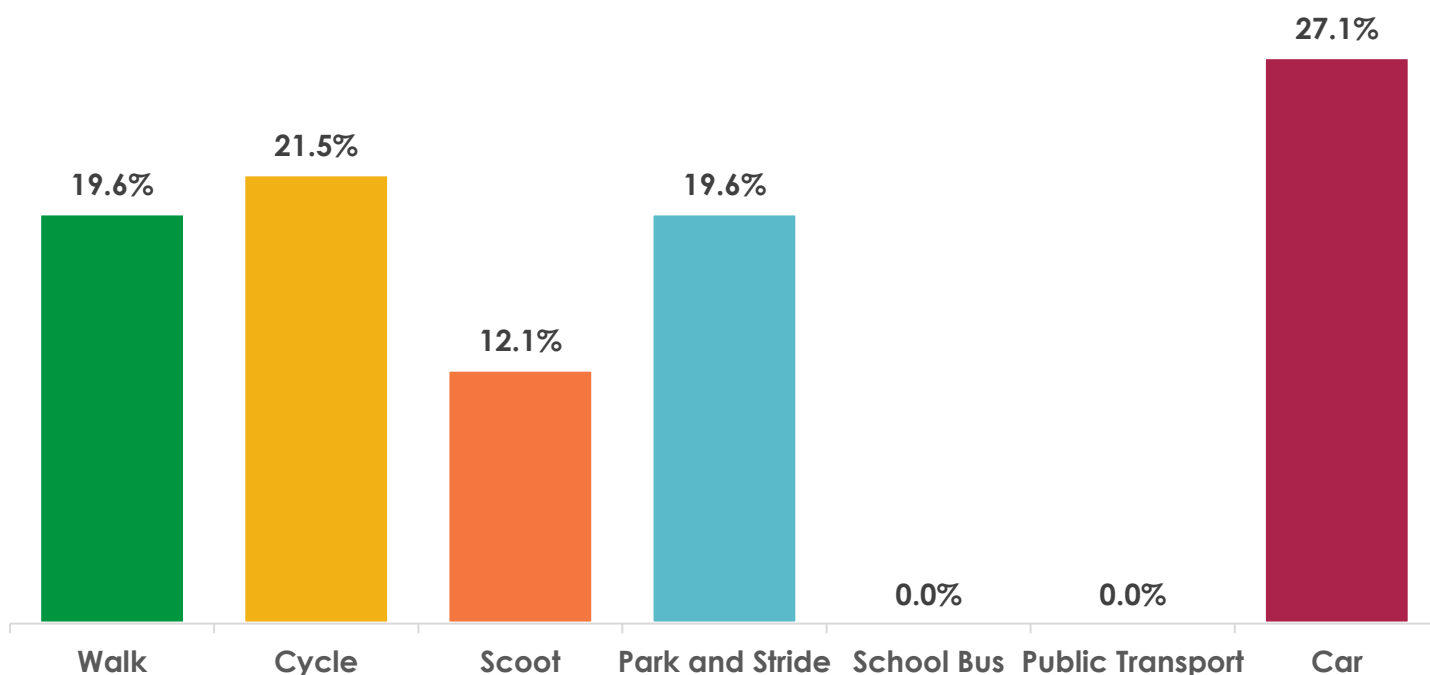
Safe Routes to School Update

The Safe Routes to School (SRTS) programme is working with schools and local authorities across Ireland to support improvements to front of school environments as well as routes to school. Gaelscoil de hÍde is delighted to be participating in the SRTS programme.

As part of the Safe Routes to School process, we previously shared the SRTS travel survey with parents/guardians to capture information on how students travel to school and on road safety issues around the school. The survey showed that:

- **75%** of parents agree that **road safety is a problem** around the school,
- **96.9%** of parents would **support works at the front of school** that improve student safety, putting pedestrians and cyclists first, and
- **95.3%** of parents would **support works that improve the walking and cycling routes** to the school.

Galway County Council is planning to undertake construction of measures at the front of school. The proposed works aim to alleviate congestion through modal shift and improve access at the front of school. The proposed scheme includes:

- Junction tightening with a **raised crossing facility** and connection to the existing cycle facility on Main St.,
- **Enhancement of the existing cycle way** on both sides of Ard Na Mara Road,
- **School Zone road markings**, and
- Introduction of **pencil bollards** and Safe Routes to School signage.
