3. Declaration of a Road to be a public Road:

(Road commencing at junction with N59 (E467,813;N750,386) in the townland of Killymongaun and extending South for a distance of 110 metres in the townland of

Killymonguan and finishing at (E467,717;N750.394) in the townland of Killymonguan.

On the Proposal of Cllr. Mannion and Seconded by Cllr. Welby

Road commencing at junction with L-5200-28 (53.12159, -9.66920) in the townland of Cill Éinne and extending South East for a distance of 115 metres in the townland of Cill Éinne and finishing at (53.12117, -9.66762) in the townland of Cill Éinne.

4. Municipal District of Conamara Director's Business:

Mr Finn informed members that the Islanders meeting had taken place Tuesday 17th June 2025 on Inishbofin.

5. Municipal District of Conamara Cathaoirleach's Business:

6. Votes of Sympathy/Congratulations:

Both Cllr Lee and Comh Curraoin extended their congratulations to the Galway ladies' teams for their victories at Comórtas Peile na Gaeltachta. Baile Chláir na Gaillimhe claimed the Senior title, while Naomh Anna Leitir Móir secured the Junior title — both teams proudly representing Galway.

Cllr Mannion offered her condolences to the roads department AO Ms Geraldine Byrne on the passing of her father.

7. AOB:

Comh Mac An Iomaire brought to the fore the serious issue regarding road safety, and particularly the schools safety. He queried if the council contacted the schools and if the Active Travel Team had put a scheme in place regarding school safety.

Cllr. Lee agreed with Comh Mac An Iomoire and voiced the importance of engagement with the schools and keeping them well informed regarding school safety plans by the Council.


Matters Arising and Responses:

- Comh Ó Curraoin, added that all schools require a pedestrian crossing outside their premises. He queried whether funding from the Notice of Motion could potentially be used to support the installation of such crossings.

- Mr. Finn replied that the Notice of Motion Money funds are available and a decision must be made regarding allocations.
- The meeting highlighted the importance of engaging external safety representatives, co-ordinating with national transport bodies, and exploring funding avenues such as the Notice of Motion. All attendees agreed on the vital role the Council plays in supporting and advancing school safety initiatives, re-affirming the need for continued dialogue and decisive action to meet the needs of local schools and communities.
