“That Galway County Council send in a submission to the Commission of the Defence Forces. It is important that we are seen to support our defence forces both on land and sea. Renmore is ideally suitable for the provision of services by the Defence forces. They can be called on at any time as a back up to the Gardai and our public services. With the possible expansion of the Dock deep water facilities it would be very suitable for the naval services to operate from. The existing Army Headquarters could act as a very effective base to deliver services when required. The pay structure of the army personnel should be review in the context of the Commission so that our soldiers are properly paid for the very dangerous work they carry out for this country both at home and with the United Nations”.
