**12. Cllr. Michael Regan**

**I will propose:**

That Galway County Council write to Coillte and ask them to carry out a full investigation on all trees beside any road or near any ESB power line.

Coillte report back to Galway County Council with exact locations of these trees and also what action and when these trees are going to be removed.

#### **I will propose:**

Galway County Council write to the relevant department for design and works to be carried out of the link road which was part of the Loughrea By Pass over twenty years ago.

On the west side at the Caherlavine roundabout to Corheen on the Gort road and also on the eastern end the Fairfield roundabout to the Masonbrook road on the Tynagh road.

### **14. Cllr. Michael Regan**

#### **I will propose:**

Galway County Council write to ComReg to highlight a serious and persistent issue with mobile phone coverage across Ireland. I travel extensively throughout the country for work, and over the past year, the reliability of mobile service has noticeably deteriorated across multiple regions and on multiple networks.

In areas that previously had dependable 3G/4G coverage,

I am now regularly experiencing:

Complete loss of signal

Calls dropping mid-conversation.

Data speeds falling to unusable levels.

Long periods of “No Service” even in populated areas.

This decline is having a direct impact on people to work efficiently and to stay connected while travelling.

I would like to understand whether this reduction in coverage is the result of:

**Reduced output or maintenance of existing masts and repeaters,**

**Reallocation of resources towards 5G rollout, or**

**Other technical or operational changes** within the network.

While investment in future technologies is important, it should not come at the expense of basic, reliable nationwide coverage—something customers already pay

for and reasonably expect.

I would appreciate clarification on what is causing these issues, as well as any planned measures to restore and improve coverage across the country. Given how widespread the problem has become, I believe a clear explanation and corrective action are urgently needed
