Item no. 2 – Election of Cathaoirleach for the Municipal District of Tuam for year 2024/2025

Item no. 3. – Schedule of dates for Municipal District of Tuam meetings for year 2024/2025

Cllr. Killilea suggested as the next meeting was due to be held on 8th July just over one week away and enquired would it be agreeable to postpone the next meeting to the second week in September and onwards thereafter. Cllr. Roche commented that bi-monthly meetings have been very productive but said perhaps it would be possible if agenda items were not pressing. Cllr. Hoade said that 8th July would make notice and agenda formation very tight.

Cllr. Cunniffe stated that he was anxious that another meeting was held soon and would rather MD meetings monthly with all the issues that need to be dealt with. Cllr. Killilea clarified that he was not suggesting a return to bi-monthly meetings but putting the date of 8th July out for re-consideration. Cllr. Turner suggested that the meeting be held instead on Monday 15th July 2024. This date was agreed by all present.

A discussion then took place in relation to the most suitable time to commence meetings going forward and it was agreed by both elected members and the executive that future meetings would commence at 2.30pm. Ms. Byrne advised she would revise the standing orders and circulate the dates to the members.

Mr. Owens congratulated all of the Councillors on their recent election success and congratulated the incoming Cathaoirleach and Leas Cathaoirleach. He said that on behalf of the staff he was very much looking forward to working with the elected members.

He outlined the benefit of the members identifying the priority areas that they would like to progress, bringing clarity to their input to the specific strategic priorities for the new Corporate Plan, the input of the MD at plenary level and to assist in identifying potential funding opportunities to progress the priorities of the MD.

Cllr. Roche congratulated Cllr. Cunniffe on his re-election and Cllr. Turner on this election. Cllr. Cunniffe thanked John Coyle, SEE and Paul Connolly former EE for all the work they had done in partnership with local groups.
